
YOUR SAFFRON WALDEN DAY VISIT 2





Spend the morning in Saffron Walden browsing our award-winning market, held twice-weekly on Tuesdays and Saturdays. In and around the Market Place, there are many independent shops and eating places to tempt you from artisan bread and beer, fresh fish, and hand-made chocolates to designer clothes, shoes, toys and books, you can buy anything you could need or want within a short walking distance.

Treat yourself to an early lunch at one of our many lovely eateries, such as Café Cou Cou, The Courtyard Tea Room (Tiptree), Kim's Tea and Coffee House, Maze, Tea Amo, Gluttons, Jolie Patisserie and the Old English Gentleman.



After lunch, drive or walk the 1 mile to the stunning Audley End House and Gardens, one of the flagships of English Heritage. Whether you're exploring the service wing, state rooms, stables, kitchen garden or beautiful parkland, you'll discover what life was like above and below stairs on a country estate.

Relax and feel free to play the piano, play with the toys in the nursery or step into Lady Braybrooke's private apartments, lit for her return from an evening party. Explore the service wing including historic kitchens, dairy and laundry rooms to see what life would have been like for the Victorian servants that worked here. Take a stroll over to the stable yard to see the horses and find out the story of the estate at work and at leisure. Further details, including opening times and

Just across the road from Audley End House, and independent from the English Heritage attraction, you will find the charming Audley End Miniature Railway and Enchanted Fairy and Elf Walk. Take one of the steam or diesel engines through the beautiful Audley End woodland, designed by Capability Brown. With hundreds of majestic trees and bustling with wildlife, be sure to keep your eyes peeled as you travel around the private 1.5 mile track.
